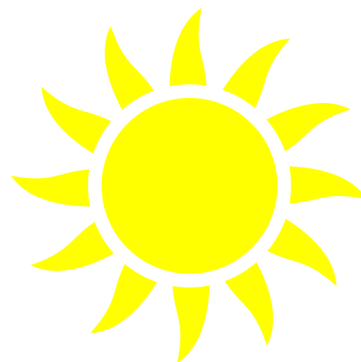


A few reminders.....
